## **Proper Methods to Disposing of Various Waste Types.**

**Tires:** Tires may be brought to Santa Rosa EPA; we will properly dispose of them at no charge to the resident.



White goods/appliances: White goods/appliances may be brought to Santa Rosa EPA for a fee of \$45. There is a fee of \$45 to drop off appliances at the Anza transfer station; we are unable to cover this fee for Santa Rosa residents. Washer/dryer machines, stoves, and refrigerators are common examples of white goods/appliances. (I will adjust this fee when we find out if there is a fee and what that fee is).

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW): HHW must be taken to a household hazardous waste collection facility by the Santa Rosa resident. These collection facilities are free of charge and located in Anza and Pinyon, each facility hosts a HHW collection event twice per year. Call Santa Rosa EPA for a schedule of the event dates. Adhesives, antifreeze, paints (oil and latex), batteries (auto, single use, rechargeable), solvents, pesticides, household cleaners, used oil and filters, swimming pool chemicals, fuels, propane cylinders/tank, fluorescent bulbs, and electronic wastes are some examples of household hazardous waste (HHW).



**Green Waste:** Green waste may be taken to and dropped off at the existing green waste dump on the reservation. Please contact Santa Rosa EPA for directions and assistance. Tree trimmings, grass mowing, and weed abatement are common green waste products.



**Electronic Waste:** Electronic waste may be brought to Santa Rosa EPA; we will properly dispose of it at no charge to the resident. Computers, televisions, VCRs, stereos, copiers, fax machines, and cell phones are common electronic products.

**Bulk waste:** Bulk waste (not including white goods/appliances) may be discarded into the 40-yard roll off bins rented by the Tribe 1-3 times per year. Please contact Santa Rosa EPA for information regarding the schedule of 40-yard roll of bin rentals. Furniture, bedding, bathtubs, toilets, and bicycles are common bulk waste products.
